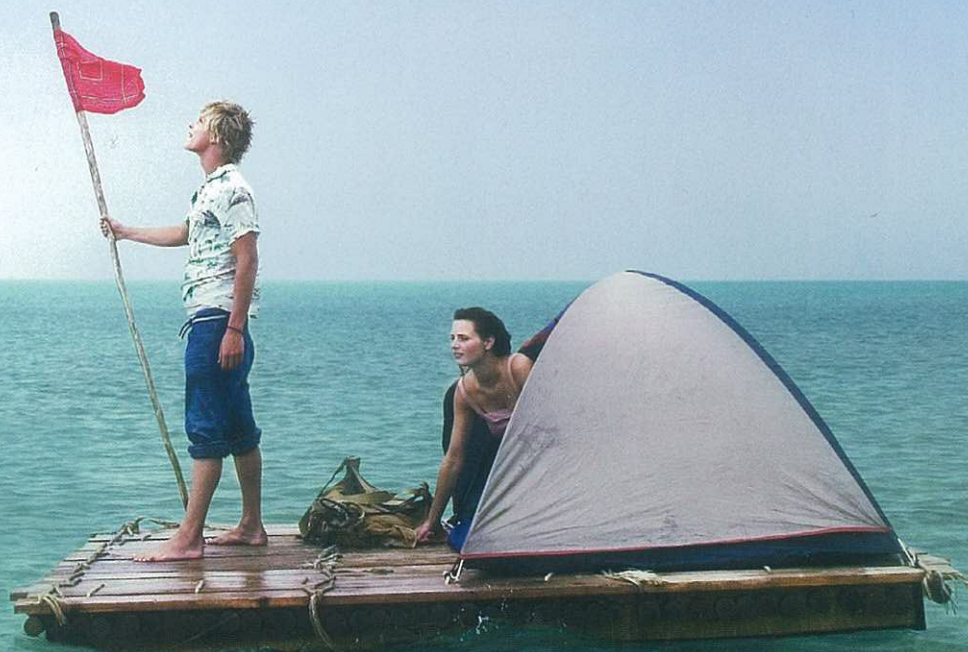

ARTZUID ■ Until 22 September

Peculiar and intriguing visions have appeared across southern Amsterdam in the last few days, thanks to open-air sculpture exhibition ARTZUID. More than 60 works from China's Ai Weiwei and a host of international artists now line Apollolaan, Minervalaan and Zuidas, a short walk from Amsterdam Zuid station. This year the theme is 'engagement', and strolling around every artwork could easily fill two or three hours.
